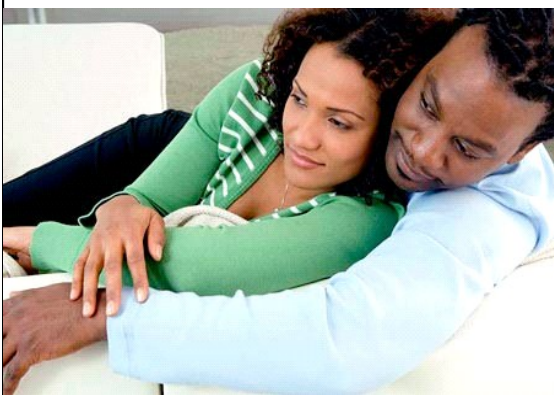


EBAN: an African concept symbolizing safety, security, and love in one's family and community.

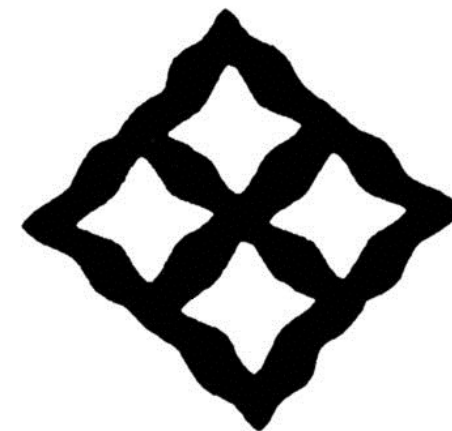

What is the EBAN II Program?

Eban II is a health program for couples living with HIV that encourages Blacks/African Americans to live healthier lives and creates a comfortable space for couples to talk about their concerns.

Who can participate in the study?

- Black/African American heterosexual couples
- One partner must be HIV positive and the other partner must be HIV negative

What does the study involve?

- 8 weekly meetings
- Spending time with your partner
- Talking with other couples affected by HIV
- Fun activities including role plays and videos
- 3 to 5 interviews over a 1-year period
- 3 to 5 HIV/STI tests over a 1-year period
- Up to \$150 to \$260 for completing study activities

How might the study help you and your partner?

- Learn about health issues affecting Blacks/African Americans
- Improve your sense of well-being as a couple and as individuals
- Feel supported to make good decisions about your health
- Help your friends, family, and community engage in healthy behaviors
- Be part of an innovative study that will help other couples living with HIV

What have other couples said about the study?

- “Before EBAN, I couldn’t talk to people about HIV and being in a relationship with someone who is different than me. Now I feel like I can.”
- “EBAN lets couples express themselves in confidential comfortable settings.”
- “Things I have learned here, my partner and I will involve in strengthening our relationship.”
- “It feels good to know that we are not alone.”
- “I have made friends in EBAN, and I know if I need them, they’ll be there for me.”
